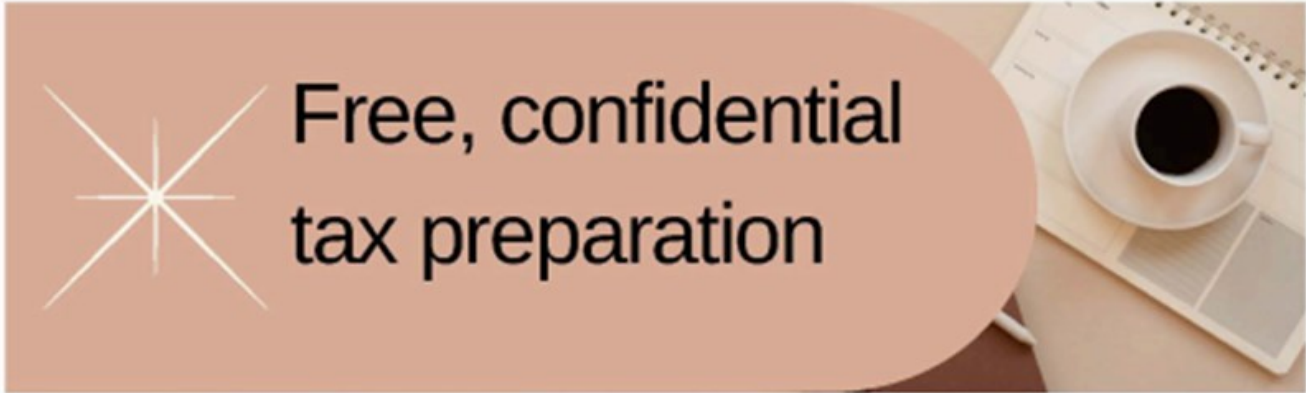

5 Ways to Actually Make Your Habits Stick



by Mel Roberts podcast

Mel shares 5 rules that will make any new habit stick. These hacks are simple, evidence-based, and easy to apply.

They help you avoid the most common traps people fall into: feeling tired, lazy and deciding to give up on your goals.

You are not alone---many people end up quitting. But not you. Not this time.

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1. Make your Goals & Habits Obvious

Make it visual. Rearrange your house to support you in remembering your goals. List goals on your bathroom sink. Put the water bottle by the coffee maker so you do not miss it. Stock refrigerator with healthy items. Every night before going to bed, lay your exercise clothes by your bed. If we make decisions for our future self the night before, we make better decisions.

2. Remove Temptation from Sight

For the things we don't want to do, let's make them harder to get. Out of sight, out of mind. Put the alcohol away. Remove candy from the house. Remove your phone from your bedroom for more sleep.

3. Track your Progress

You need a system to track your progress outside your mind. Make a to-do list. Check boxes on paper. Mark done on your calendar. Track your progress on a phone app. The more often you track your progress, the greater the likelihood you will succeed. The chances of your success are even more likely if you report your progress publicly or you physically report it.

4. Create a Clear Plan

You are more likely to succeed at behavior change if you make specific plans to implement it. Plan ahead. When am I working out tomorrow? How am I working out? Walking, biking, weights etc. What am I wearing? What is your plan if someone serves cake and you want to stop eating sugar? What is your plan if you want to eat healthy? Make a menu plan for the week.

5. Do this in the Morning

Get up early and get it done in the morning. Your willpower, ability to focus, and speed of processing are highest in the morning.

You are what you repeatedly do. If you always wanted to be a person that is financially free, you develop patterns to pay off debt. You develop patterns around how you spend money and how you invest it. These patterns lead you to the kind of person you want to be.
